

Teams from Sault Ste. Marie and Markham-Toronto also competed in the round-robin event with the top two teams squaring off for the championship match. North Bay Mayor Al McDonald was on hand for both the opening and closing ceremonies. Sault Ste. Marie has expressed interest in hosting the event next year, but home-and-home series with teams from Timmins, Sudbury, Markham and Toronto are expected to be ongoing.

IMMIGRATION SYMPOSIUM SCHEDULED OCTOBER 1ST

We are working with a number of partners to hold an immigration symposium in Temiskaming Shores October 1st.

The experiences of North Bay and Timmins will be used as case studies for municipal officials, Chambers of Commerce staff and members, business leaders and other interested parties from Parry Sound to Hearst to help them attract skilled immigrants to their municipalities and retain them once they arrive.

The North Bay & District Multicultural Centre, Timmins & District Multicultural Centre, Pathways to Prosperity, Labour Market Group, Far Northeast Training Board and the City of Temiskaming Shores are hosting the event at Riverside Place in New Liskeard.

The morning session will cover rural immigration needs and trends in Northeastern Ontario, best practices and resources, while the afternoon will cover planning for the future and next steps.
